

TOM STUCKEY – PROFILE

Tom Stuckey was Chair of the Southampton Methodist District, and a former Canon of Salisbury Cathedral. He is married to Christine who is to be the MWiB President for the Southampton District. Tom and Christine live in Christchurch Dorset. They have three grown up children and four grandchildren. They both enjoy music, gardening, classic cars and theological conversation.



Tom has ministered for 50 years in a variety of appointments; a mining community in Scotland, a new town, city centre, university, inner city, council estate, inner urban and rural situations. His appointment to the staff of the Northern Federation for Training in Ministry, Manchester in 1982 enabled him to be involved in the ecumenical training of ministers and to teach, preach and lecture on mission both in this country and overseas.

Already an author of articles and publications, his visits to India, Sri Lanka and Malaysia led to the writing of his major book on the 'theology of mission in an age of violence'. He attempted to apply some of these insights as Superintendent of a large circuit in the South of England before becoming Chair (in Anglican terms 'bishop') of a large District in the South of England. In 2005 he became President of the Methodist Church in Britain.

He has lectured and preached in Cuba, South Africa, Jamaica, Northern Ireland and New Zealand. Books have followed (see authors books); his latest is about the relevance of 'atonement theology in an age of violence.'



At present he is a visiting scholar at Sarum College, Salisbury and continues to write, preach, teach and speak throughout the UK.
